FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL

Thursday, September 1, 2011 will be the first day of school. The fall semester for Beaver Dam Middle School will begin at 7:40 a.m. Students should report to their homeroom.

Dismissal Time - School will dismiss at 2:42 p.m. Buses will leave the Middle School by 2:47 p.m. Bus pick up will be at the back of the school on Mackie Street. Please do not park in the bus loading zones in the back of the building or in the handicap parking in the front of the building.

Bicycles - If you ride a bike to school, you need to walk it while on school property and it must be parked in the bike racks located in the back of school. All students need to lock their bike every day since we will not have a secured area for bikes. Do not park bikes at the public library or on private property.

Skateboards - If you ride a skateboard to school, you need to pick up the skateboard and walk with it while on school property.

Rollerblades - No rollerblades are allowed to be worn in the building. This includes tennis shoes with the wheels on the bottom. They cause damage to the carpeting and the finish on the floors. Students are allowed to wear them to school as long as they remove them before entering the building.

FEES/REGISTRATION

This year registration is two weeks before school begins. Students/parents may register at any of these times: Monday, August 15 from 2:30-6:30 p.m., Wednesday, August 17 from 6:30 a.m.—2:30 p.m., or Thursday, August 18 from Noon—6:00 p.m.

After completing the registration process, student schedules will be distributed. The registration fee is \$35.00. There is also a \$30.00/sport (family maximum of \$120) co-curricular fee for students who wish to participate in after-school co-curricular athletic activities. Registration is the first opportunity to pay lunch fees. Any payments made on lunch accounts must be made on a separate check. Gym locks will be provided.

TRANSFERS

Students transferring into and out of the district are requested to call or provide this information to the Middle School prior to opening day. Students new to the Beaver Dam Unified School District should bring their previous school year's report card when registering. Students transferring out of the district are requested to call or provide this information to the Middle School prior to the first day of school.

Middle School Lunch/Breakfast Information

The Skyward Lunch Program and Breakfast Program will be used again this year at the Beaver Dam Middle School. If you are going to have a new student in the district, your student will be assigned a Pin Number that can be used for purchasing lunch/breakfast/milk.

Prices for the Reimbursable Meals for the 2011-2012 School Year are as follows:

A reimbursable student breakfast will cost \$1.30 and a reduced priced student breakfast is 30¢.
Adult breakfast will cost \$1.75.

A reimbursable student lunch will cost \$2.30 and 40¢ for a reduced priced meal.
Adult lunch will cost \$3.00 at any of the lines.

Parents may make payments for their family account at any of the districts school offices or on-line by going to the districts website and following the instructions for payments. As per Board Policy 760.1-Rule, money must be deposited into family lunch/breakfast account for your students to participate in the School Lunch/Breakfast Program

Free and Reduced Lunch/Breakfast Program

The Free/Reduced applications need to be completed each year for students to receive Free/Reduced Lunch/Breakfast meals. Families that received Free/Reduced meals in 2010-2011 school year must complete a new application for the 2011-2012 school year.

Attention 7th & 8th Graders Interested in Tackle Football

7th/8th grade football is a program that involves a commitment from each athlete to want to learn the fundamentals of tackle football. The football program will begin on Tuesday, August 9 at the Middle School with the handing out of equipment in the small gym/cafeteria; 8th grade at 5:00 p.m. and 7th grade at 6:00 p.m. Practice will be held Wednesday, August 10, and the week of August 22 from 3:00-5:30 p.m. Wear only your helmet, shorts, and tennis shoes. We will practice on the field above the tennis courts at the High School. A practice schedule will be handed out the first week.

Important Reminder:

It is also necessary to have you and your child's signature acknowledging that you have read the Co-Curricular Code of Conduct Handbook and agree to the conditions set forth in the Handbook. The code book will be handed out at the first practice.

Beaver Dam Middle School Dress Code

It is of the utmost importance for all members of our learning community to dress in an appropriate manner while attending school. Many of today's trendiest fashion lines that are being marketed toward our children are not appropriate for school and school sponsored events. All students will receive a student handbook on the first day of school that will articulate our dress code in detail.

The following guidelines will be enforced at BDMS:

1. Clothing that reveals undergarments will be unacceptable.
2. The following clothing items are not permitted: spaghetti strap tops, strapless tops, low cut necklines, bare back or clothing inappropriately revealing.
3. Loose chains or straps are unacceptable.
4. Shirts and tops must touch the top of the pants/skirts/shorts when sitting and/or standing.
5. Skirts can be no shorter than mid thigh. Skirts must reach past the end of a student's fingers when her hands are resting at her side.
6. The wearing of clothing items which promotes or suggests drugs/alcohol/tobacco products or display inappropriate language, is prohibited.
7. State health requirements demand that shoes or sandals must be worn at all times in the school building.
8. Wearing of hats, bandanas or other headgear is not acceptable in the school during regular school hours.

Welcome Back Students and Parents! The Pupil Personnel Services Team is excited and ready for the start of the 2009-2010 school year. The Pupil Personnel Services Team (school counselor, school psychologist, school social worker, and school nurse) provides students with information, support, encouragement and instruction as it has done for the past several years. These services assist students in developing personal, social, academic, and vocational skills in order to be successful in today's world.

The Pupil Services Team assists students in a variety of ways. Pupil Personnel workers may lead classroom discussions from time to time as it relates to classroom needs. The students will also have the opportunity to participate in small group work. These groups will focus on a variety of topics ranging from relationships, personal growth, alcohol and other drug abuse and study skills, as well as others. Students are selected for these discussion groups based on parent, teacher, or student request. The students also have the opportunity to speak individually to Pupil Personnel Services workers if requested by parents, teachers, or themselves.

Reporting Absences - 885-7365, Press 4

Please call the Absence Line to report any absences, late arrivals, early releases and extended absences. The number is 885-7365 then press 4 to leave a message on the Absence Line.

You may dial Cyd Rohr direct by calling 885-7365, ext. 3119, however the Student Office is a very busy place, especially first thing in the morning and your call may be connected to the voice mail. When you hear the start of the greeting on the voice mail, you can simply press the pound (#) key and begin leaving your message at the sound of the beep instead of listening to the entire greeting. Please leave the student's name, reason for absence, late arrival or if they need to be excused early for an appointment and give the time the student should be dismissed. It is our policy to check our messages by 8:00 a.m.

We need a call **every day** the student is out. If you know the absence will be for a specific number of days, tell us the first day you call and the days will be marked accordingly at that time. You can call and report an absence any time during the day, but preferably in the morning. The school will call parents if we have not received a call and will continue to call until a parent or guardian is reached.

BDMS School Security

To continue to maintain our safe school environment, security cameras have been placed in the building hallways, on the school entrances, and around the outside of the buildings at both the Middle School and High School. The cameras will help us monitor building activity during the day, as well as before and after the school day ends.

The Middle School monitors everyone who enters our building by having only one entrance available to visitors. Door S1 (the handicapped entrance on Fourth Street) will be the door where all visitors must enter at BDMS. Since the doors will be locked when visitors come to our building, they will be buzzed into the building. After coming into the building, **all visitors are required to sign-in at the Main Office before traveling through the building.** If you are seen in the building without wearing a visitor's pass, you will be asked to report to the office and sign-in immediately.
